Dr. Jesi Leonard, Scarlett Mobile Large Animal Services

Dr. Jesica Leonard is a 2015 graduate of NC State's College of Veterinary Medicine. Dr. Leonard also received her undergraduate degrees from NC State's Departments of Animal and Poultry Science in 2011. A native of Falkland, North Carolina, Dr. Leonard grew up on a small farm raising beef cattle and sheep. Throughout veterinary school, Dr. Leonard was involved with short-term Christian Veterinary Missions to the Navajo Nation and Alaskan Yup'ik people. Her professional interests include ruminant nutrition, poultry medicine and small ruminant medicine. In her free time, she enjoys hiking, camping, cooking, traveling and cheering for NC State's Wolfpack.



Dr. Heather Glennon, University of Mt. Olive

Dr. Heather Glennon has been raising goats since she was seven years old and started in the 4-H program in Florida. She raised dairy goats for about 20 years as she moved from Florida to Maryland to Pennsylvania. She received her B.S. Degree from Delaware Valley College and then spent four years as a 4-H/Livestock Extension Agent in PA. Dr. Glennon received her M.S. Degree in Animal Science and PhD in Crop Science from NCSU while working as the Research Specialist for the Meat Goat and Forage Program. At NCSU, she conducted multiple grazing and parasite control trials with meat goats under Dr. Luginbuhl. She currently has

about 50 commercial meat does (Boer x Kiko cross). Currently, she is an Assistant Professor of Animal Science at the University of Mount Olive helping to develop a pastured livestock unit.



John Brasfield, Brasfield Club Lambs

John Brasfield graduated from Virginia Tech with a B.S. in Animal Science and from NC State with a Masters degree in Animal Science/Nutrition. He has three daughters who all grew up in 4-H and showed sheep until they aged out. So far, he has three grandsons. He has been married to his wife, Laurie, for almost 40 years. John is retired from NC Cooperative Extension, where he was both the Livestock Agent and the County Extension Director in
