Dr. Jeannette Moore, NC State University

Dr. Jeannette Moore is a Professor of Animal Science at NC State University. She teaches and mentors undergraduate and graduate students, and she is involved with Cooperative Extension. Dr. Moore enjoys interacting with producers, with youth, and with Extension Agents in the state. Her specialty is Animal Nutrition, and she has taught Intro to Animal Science, Animal Nutrition, Small Ruminant Management, Intro to Equine Science, and other classes at NC State University.



Dr. Kevin Anderson, NC State Veterinary Medicine

Dr. Kevin L. Anderson is a Professor of Ruminant Health Management at the College of Veterinary Medicine at NC State University. He grew up on a family dairy and crop farm in Minnesota and received his DVM from the University of Minnesota. As a clinical educator at the College, he has been involved in multiple aspects of ruminant health management. His research focus has been on infectious and metabolic diseases of ruminants, with a major interest in mastitis and milk quality of the ruminant species. Teaching efforts include veterinary, graduate and undergraduate courses, with considerable involvement in the College's Teaching Animal Unit (TAU).



Dr. Andrew Weaver, NC State Extension

Dr. Andrew Weaver is the Small Ruminant Specialist at NC State. Dr. Weaver grew up in central Michigan and was active in 4-H youth livestock programs. He attended Michigan State University majoring in Animal Science and completed his M.S. at Virginia Tech studying terminal sire options for hair sheep producers. That research led him to West Virginia University where he completed his Ph.D. in Dr. Scott Bowdridge's parasite immunology lab.



Dr. Scott Greiner, Virginia Tech

Dr. Scott Greiner is a Professor and Extension Animal Scientist in the Department of Animal and Poultry Sciences at Virginia Tech. Dr. Greiner was raised on a diversified livestock farm in Eastern Iowa, and attended Iowa State University where he earned a B.S. in Animal Science in 1989. His graduate studies included a M.S. from Michigan State University and a Ph.D. from Iowa State. In 1998, Greiner joined the faculty at Virginia Tech and now serves as Extension Project Leader for the department as well as chair of the interdisciplinary college Animal Production Program Team. As an Extension Animal Scientist, he designs and delivers educational programs in beef cattle and sheep to adults and youth, and conducts applied research.
